MINUTES FROM THE REGULAR ANTWERP TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, September 11, 2018

Supervisor Ruzick called the Public Hearing to order at 6:00 pm.

- Mattawan Fire Department: 1.4 mills for an estimated \$322,905.57 for 2018 tax year
- Lawton Fire Department: 1.4 mills for an estimated \$121,231.68 for 2018 tax year
- Paw Paw Fire Department: 1.4 mills for an estimated \$63,125.64 for 2018 tax year
- Mattawan Quick Response: .1295 mills for an estimated \$29,905.76 for 2018 tax year Public Hearing closed at 6:26 pm.

Supervisor Ruzick called the board meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

Board Members Present: Daniel J. Ruzick-Supervisor, Bonnie Osborne-Treasurer, Chantel Reyna-Clerk, Bruce Cutting- Trustee, Gary Stock- Trustee

Also Present: Eleven guests.

Motion by Osborne, second by Cutting to approve agenda with addition of M. Planning Commission member, Phil Tarchala, training under New Business. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

Public Comment:

- Randall Pete- Republican nomination for County Commission introduced himself as well as handed out literature explaining who he was.
- Charles Brandt- thanked the Township for consideration of Amusement Park possibly coming into Township.

Motion by Osborne, second by Cutting to approve the August 14th, 2018 Township Board Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

Action on Planning Commission Recommendations:

- A. Site Plan Review. CopperMags, LLC 29063 Red Arrow Hwy, parcel #80-02-009-012-00. Planning Commission recommends approval contingent on:
 - 1. Installation of protective fencing prior to site development.
 - 2. Compliance with minimum parking lot and lighting requirements.
 - 3. Approval from following agencies.
 - a. Drain Commission (stormwater)
 - b. Road Commission (driveway)
 - c. Health Department (sufficient septic for commercial use)
 - d. Fire Department.

Township received approval from Van Buren County Road Commission as well as Van Buren County Health Department prior to meeting.

Motion by Cutting, second by Osborne to approve site plan.

Roll Call Vote: Ruzick-yes; Osborne-yes; Cutting-yes; Reyna-yes; Stock-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

B. Zoning Ordinance Amendments. Section 2.5- General Amusement Attraction; Table 6-1 Table of Uses – General Amusement Attraction; Section 9.10 Cemetery; Section 9.20 General Amusement Attraction (New); Renumbering section references 9.20 and above.

Board recommends approval contingent on two amendments

- 1. Section 9.20 C. Hours of Operation to read: Hours may be restricted during special land use and site plan review to further protect neighboring property from potential disturbance and also based on the nature of the proposal.
- 2. Section 9.20 D. Sound and Noise to read: Amplified sound and other non-amplified noise generated from the attraction shall not present a nuisance.

Motion by Stock, second by Cutting to approve with amendments.

Roll Call Vote: Osborne-yes; Reyna-yes; Cutting-yes; Stock-yes; Ruzick-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

New Business:

A. AEP request for telecom fiber optic line

Chris Adams wanted to address issues she had with the letter drafted by Schuittmaker's Law Office. She feels that the easement that AEP has only pertains to power or source of power and that fiber optic is not power. She asked that her name be removed from the letter since there are others affected as well. She also pointed out that there are more than 4 existing lines already on the pole in question. It was further discussed that the letter be redrafted asking AEP to submit a letter stating that their line will not be used for public use and that if it ever does become a public line, it shall be removed from the pole and buried underground at the expense of AEP or any future assignees.

Motion by Osborne, second by Cutting to have Supervisor Ruzick and Trustee Stock draft letter. Roll Call Vote: Reyna-yes; Osborne-yes; Stock-yes; Cutting-yes; Ruzick-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

B. Antwerp Township Planner/Zoning Administrator Proposals

Proposal was received from David Jirousek, who was previously employed with Williams and Works, to become our Planner through his new company, Horizon Community Planning. There was recommendation from the Planning Commission to retain David as our planner and contract with Horizon Community Planning.

Motion by Stock, second by Osborne to accept David Jirousek's proposal with Horizon Community Planning. Roll Call Vote: Cutting-yes; Reyna-yes; Osborne-yes; Ruzick-yes; Stock-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

C. Appointment to Zoning Board of Appeals

There was a vacancy to the Zoning Board of Appeals left by Heather Mitchell as Township representative that needed to be filled. Trustee Stock stepped down as Chair and expressed interest in being the Township representative.

Motion by Ruzick, second by Osborne to appoint Gary Stock to the Zoning Board of Appeals Board as Township representative. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

D. Appointment to Planning Commission

There was a vacancy on the Planning Commission left by Ron Derhammer. Trustee Stock expressed interest in being on the Planning Commission.

Motion by Cutting, second by Osborne to appoint Gary Stock Township representative to the Planning Commission. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

E. Mattawan Fire Special Assessment

Public hearing held at 6:00 pm. Assessment is for 1.4000 mills for the 2018 tax year for an estimated \$322,905.57 in tax revenue. The assessment will be levied on real property only.

Motion by Osborne, second by Cutting to approve 1.4000 mills for the Mattawan Fire Special Assessment. Roll Call Vote: Reyna-yes; Osborne-yes; Stock-yes; Cutting-yes; Ruzick-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

F. Lawton Fire Special Assessment

Public hearing held at 6:25 pm. Assessment is for 1.4000 mills for the 2018 tax year for an estimated \$121,231.68 in tax revenue. The assessment will be levied on real property only.

Motion by Cutting, second by Osborne to approve 1.4000 mills for the Lawton Fire Special Assessment. Roll Call Vote: Stock-yes; Ruzick-yes; Reyna-yes; Osborne-yes; Cutting-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

G. Paw Paw Fire Special Assessment

Public hearing held at 6:20 pm. Assessment is for 1.4000 mills for the 2018 tax year for an estimated \$63,125.64 in tax revenue. The assessment will be levied on real property only.

Motion by Osborne, second by Reyna to approve 1.4000 mills for the Paw Paw Fire Special Assessment. Roll Call Vote: Ruzick-yes; Stock-yes; Cutting-yes; Osborne-yes; Reyna-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

H. Mattawan Quick Response Special Assessment

Public hearing held at 6:10 pm. Assessment is for .1295 mills for the 2018 tax year for an estimated \$29,905.76 in tax revenue. The assessment will be levied on real property only.

Motion by Cutting, second by Osborne to approve .1295 mills for the Mattawan Quick Response Special Assessment.

Roll Call Vote: Reyna-yes, Osborne-yes, Ruzick-yes, Stock-yes, Cutting-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

I. Activity Center cabinets for bathrooms

Woodsmiths has presented a quote in the amount of \$1,030.00 for cabinets in both the men and women's bathrooms of the Activity Center for storage of additional supplies.

Motion by Osborne, second by Cutting to approve Woodsmiths quote for cabinets.

Roll Call Vote: Osborne-yes, Stock-yes, Reyna-yes, Ruzick-yes, Cutting-yes. All voted in favor, Motion carries.

J. Antwerp Township Group Pension plan

The Township group pension plan needs to be updated to reflect the new personnel policy adopted on August 14, 2018.

Motion by Cutting, second by Stock to accept the changes to the pension plan.

Roll Call Vote: Stock-yes, Cutting-yes, Ruzick-yes, Osborne-yes, Reyna-yes. All voted in favor, Motion carries.

K. Part time position vacancy

The Township has been working with Robert Half to fill the vacancy left by Chantel Reyna to help with clerk duties. Currently, Kristina Henderson is working 15-20 a week. Clerk Reyna would like for Kristina to be able to work up to 30 hours a week and after 120 days the option to hire as a Township employee.

Motion by Reyna, second by Osborne to allow up to 30 hours a week and ability to hire after 120 days. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

L. Resolution to VBCRC for speed study

Township is requesting the VBCRC conduct a speed study on C.R. 364 from the village limits to C.R. 657 due to increase traffic over the last two years with the new neighborhood and school.

Motion by Cutting, second by Stock to send resolution requesting speed study to VBCRC.

Roll Call Vote: Reyna-yes, Osborne-yes, Cutting-yes, Ruzick-yes, Stock-yes. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

M. MSU Extension Community Planner training

Phil Tarchala, Planning Commission member is wanting to attend this training from September 20^{th} – September 22^{nd} in Grand Rapids in the amount of \$630.00. The board thinks this will be very beneficial to the Planning Commission.
