Energy provider will work to determine new route to provide more reliability for southwest Michigan

Consumers Energy announced today that it will not use the original route proposed for the new 20-mile high voltage distribution line in Van Buren county. Community members provided valuable feedback and the energy provider will seek an alternative route to improve reliability in southwest Michigan while reducing the impacts to the surrounding community.

But as we listen to and work with the community, we will come up with a solution that minimizes the impact to the area while delivering reliable energy."
